Leadership and Anxiety in the Church: A Family Systems Perspective

Since the publication of Dr. Edwin Friedman's *Generation to Generation*, many pastors and other church leaders have become aware of Bowen family systems theory as a way of understanding congregational dynamics. Family systems theory identifies differentiation of self and anxiety as two key variables impacting human functioning. The seminar on ***Leadership and Anxiety in the Church*** looks at the challenge presented by the rising levels of anxiety being experienced in churches today, as well as the role that self-differentiated leadership can play in calming such anxiety.

The seminar is comprised of a series of PowerPoint presentations originally conceived for LMPC's *Advanced Clergy Clinic in Family Emotional Process*. Works of art from the Medieval, Renaissance, and Baroque eras are integrated at various points to facilitate theological reflection on the themes being presented. The full seminar would be appropriate for a continuing education event for pastors or a pastor-spouse retreat. Any of the topics listed below can also stand alone as a plenary address for a larger gathering. ***The Road to Damascus*** would be particularly appropriate for a judicatory or denominational assembly, since it can be adapted to appeal to audiences that include clergy and lay leaders.
