WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

This one-day workshop introduces church leaders to the key concepts of circle processes and ways in which circles can be used within their congregations. Restorative conversations are useful when working through difficult or polarizing topics, processing shared painful experiences, building community, and dealing with certain levels of conflict in the church setting. The workshop covers the historical roots, biblical foundations, and core values and beliefs of restorative conversations. In addition, the key elements of circle processes will be demonstrated for participants by engaging in circle processes during the workshop. The workshop will benefit all levels of leadership including pastors, lay leaders, youth leaders, and Sunday school teachers.

THE DETAILS

- The workshop will begin at 9 a.m. and last until 4:00 p.m.
 - The Zoom session will be presented based on the Central Time Zone
- There will be two 15-minute breaks - one in the morning and the other in the afternoon - as well as an hour break for lunch.
- Executive Director of the Lombard Mennonite Peace Center, Jay Wittmeyer, will present the workshop.
